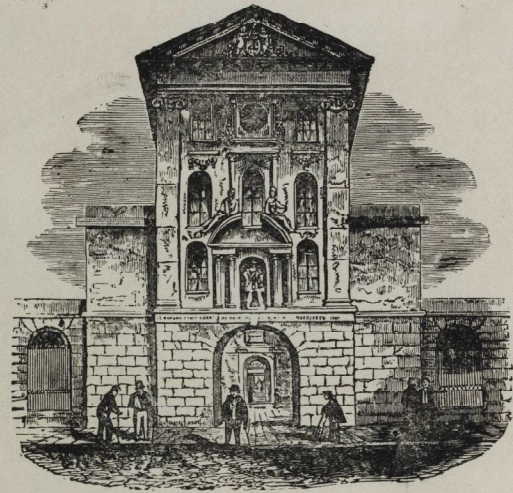

Editorial Notes.
