National Watermark Accreditation

QMUL have been awarded the National Co-ordinating Centre for Public Engagement (NCCPE) Watermark, recognising institutional cultures supporting excellence in public engagement. QMUL are the first Higher Education Institution to attain the chartermark-style accreditation, with the level of award to be formally announced later this year.

Funding for PE activity

The Centre for Public Engagement's allocation of the College's Higher Education Innovation Fund (HEIF) funds for public engagement 2016 have been allocated this month. Over £90K has been awarded to nine projects at the time of writing, running across the Faculties and with the potential for significant impact.

Recognising and Rewarding Excellence

The Engagement and Enterprise Awards 2016 will open next month to recognise excellence in the application of QMUL research and learning through work in public engagement, academic innovation, student enterprise and public relations.
