Assessment Handbook 2017-18 (minutes 2016.140-2016.141)

Some members of Senate had expressed concern with regard to QMUL's policy on penalties for the late submission of work and the policy on final module marks which required marks to be held to one decimal place and not rounded to the next integer. In response to these concerns, further consultation on each matter was undertaken at the summer meetings of the Degree Examination Boards, with input from the External Member of the Degree Examination Boards.

The Education Quality and Standards Board considered both late work penalties and the policy on final module marks at its meeting on 20 September 2017. It was agreed that the policy for the late submission of work and the recording of module marks would not be subject to further review at the current time.
