VP SETL Update, September 2017

2017/18 student admissions

As of 18 September, undergraduate figures were 4090 for Home/EU and 1013 for Overseas students. Modelling suggests that by the time of the 1 December snapshot, we should be 53 over target for Home/EU and 12 over for Overseas students. For postgraduate taught programmes, as of 14 September, anticipated enrolment was 1547 for Home/EU students and 2347 for Overseas students. Our modelling suggests that on 1 December we will be 50 over target for Home/EU students and 509 over for Overseas students. Away from London, 2017/18 sees the first intake of students for the Malta Medicine MBBS programme, with around 40 students in this first cohort. In China, the Joint Educational Institute, a partnership between QMUL and the Northwestern Polytechnical University, has welcomed its first cohort of undergraduate students in Xi'an, China. 249 students have been recruited onto the programme. Student Survey Results

Results for the National Student Survey (NSS) and Postgraduate Taught Experience Survey (PTES) were published over the summer. In the NSS, QMUL's overall satisfaction score was 83.41%, which is 0.77% below the sector average (84.18%) and ranks us nationally at 90th of 146 institutions. At subject level, the results look more positive: 16 of our subjects have overall satisfaction scores higher than the average sector satisfaction, and 14 subjects are below. NSS response rates were affected by the Students' Union boycott. As a result, our response rate (58%) was lower than in previous years. PTES results were comparable with 2016, which means that improvements since 2015 have been consolidated. The highest levels of satisfaction were with Teaching and Learning (81.5%) but, as with the NSS, the lowest score related to the promptness (56.3%) and usefulness (63%) of feedback.
