Points for Senate members to note and further information	The Research Degree Programmes and Examinations Board is reviewing the Code of Practice for Research Degrees and the Academic Regulations for Research Degrees. A small working group comprising the Faculty Deputy Deans for Research and the Assistant Academic Registrar (Research Degrees) is developing new drafts. There will be a consultation on the changes with schools and institutes in the summer. The proposals will be discussed at RDPEB, the Doctoral College Management Group, and the VP Research Advisory Group. Drafts will be circulated to Senate for comment in advance of the commencement of the new academic year.
