SSLC in Lockdown – 29<sup>th</sup> April 2020.

## **SUMMARY**

- We met to discuss specifically the student experience of online teaching and learning and to gather student feedback on this matter.
- Overall, students reported a positive experience of online teaching, with Collaborate in
  particular being intuitive and easy to use. Students like the 'raising hand' tool, as it helps to
  create a classroom feeling. They particularly appreciate the interactive functionalities, and
  when academics really know how to use the format, it is really very good. Students also find
  being able to refer back to the recordings helpful, and they do use those especially to recap
  and in cases of lost connectivity during the class. Professors have different teaching methods
  and ways of presenting, and students appreciate this variety. Connectivity issues and
  different timezones have been considered by academics and taken into account during
  teaching.
- Students reported some difficulties with academics not being very familiar with the online formats, in particular forgetting to switch on the recording function until part-way through the lesson, and not switching on chat/microphone/video functions for interaction. It was agreed to remind academics of the functions.
- Students reported it has been difficult to maintain a sense of community during the
  lockdown period. Reps are reaching out but responses are not overly forthcoming, and
  students tend to communicate when they have a class. It is understood that everyone is
  dealing with the change in their own way, but Reps know of some students with difficult
  situations. Reps were reminded that they are not expected to be counsellors, and of the
  online Welfare facilities available at QMUL.
