Modules

EEE – Coursework issues – Instructions are not clear on the assessments; they need to made clearer

 Timetabling – Students would prefer a day off. Timetables seem to packed, without enough time for independent work especially with daily lectures and labs. Students are unable to complete labs.

Maths – Students are straddling / No examples for midterms / Not allowed calculators but exams are harder

Midterm results are low - more examples of what to expect on the midterm

Need a change of structure to the tutorials?

Programming – Need more project based programming work / Students agreed they would prefer more programming / Students feel they need more balance between exams and project based assessments.

Professional Research Practice – students feel they need more lab time; more time to get their work done (suggested 2hr rather than 1hr). Potential issues with timetabling.

PRP – No solid foundations for students to understand references.

Antonios: Informed students about the 'Find it, use it, reference it' tool and how to find it online

Computer Science & Networks (Arman) – Information overload, very complex and hard to understand – delivery is not student friendly

Labs - more interaction needed before working through the worksheet

Fundamentals of Management Seminars – Not enough time to get through the work

Digital Audio (Sem B) - Modules need Q-Review. Students are struggling.

Students have emailed and queried

Creative Computing (Database Module) - Timetabling - Labs & lectures are muddled

Third Year – More info needed on individual modules before having to choose modules e.g. lecture slides on what the teaching entails

- More module descriptors
- Students should look at past papers to see what is assessed Demonstrator sessions to explain what each module is

Demonstrators in labs – they should know the topic. They seem to be teaching the wrong thing or not know what they are talking about.

 More training for demonstrators – Not solely based on academic performance as this doesn't indicate teaching ability

Forum for peers - To support each other with struggles

References - Consensus needed on the best way to reference

More lab sessions for processing (Application Programming) – Suggested seeing Karen Shoop as she maintains office hours and is regularly available to students

Access – Student cards not working to enter design studios/SEMS especially on the weekends

Strikes – Students were wondering what will happen with due process. Some lecturers may contact students and let them know.
