Review of actions from previous meeting:

SSC5a in Malta

- Dr Patel has had discussions with Dr Broad and is scheduling a meeting with Professor Molyneaux. Lectures event to take place on the 7th January awaiting confirmation from the MDU.

Invitations to London teaching sessions for Malta students

- Robert Sprott has liaised with Prof. Molyneaux and links to lectures will be made available to students in Malta.

SJT confusion and lack of mark scheme for the new online exam

- A petition was formed in collaboration with multiple medical schools asking for the markscheme to be released. The UKFPO responded that the SJT is an exam that students do not need to revise for and thus no mark scheme is needed.

Finals format

- A letter was sent to Stephanie Marshall to voice our concerns from the course reps. Discussions have taken place between Anthony Warren and Stephanie Marshall.
- The decision has been taken for all medical school exams to take place online (invigilated).
- This decision will be reassessed in the new year and there may be a possibility that some exams take place in person.
- It has been decided that this news will be released to students after Christmas.
- The PSA exam will also be taken online from home (invigilated)
 - For these online exams rooms in the Garrod and Bancroft building can be booked to do these exams.
 - People can apply for the hardship fund to get a minimum spec laptop if they do not have a suitable device to use. This fund however is very limited.

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Assessment format - progress test and OSCE	 Students wondered if it would be possible to divide the modules into relevant categories and add more questions to the assessment. There were some questions on topics that weren't covered in great detail. It wouldn't be possible to have more questions as teaching staff would struggle to create them.
