4. Theatres/ scrubbing in (First Year 5 item as-well)	 Students wearing headscarves have faced difficulties accessing surgical hoods - this has put students off scrubbing in on placement. 2. Testing for COVID-19 (particularly in surgery)	 On entering theatre students have been asked if they have been tested recently but the school has made no provision for regular testing. In general, students have been asked for proof that they are not infected with COVID. There have been students exposed to COVID on the wards who have not had access to priority NHS essential worker testing. 	- A policy should be created for testing students: to be brought up at the Associate Deans meeting.	
3. Confusion with procedures and trust protocols	 Students are being asked to complete HCA training as part of their placement at certain trusts. This is outside of the realms of the curriculum and have been paid roles previously. Students feel that they are being put under pressure to complete this training on top of their degree work as many have other commitments. There are inequalities between trust placement provisions, some students are getting much less placement time than others. 	-	- Charalambos to flag this up

4. Concerns about Queen's and KGH - high number of COVID-19 cases	 Students have been taken off some wards due to a rising numbers of COVID- 19 cases but this has led to confusion as they are not being made aware beforehand. 	-	- Charalambos to flag this up
