### **MSc Surgical Skills with the University of Malta (minutes SE2018.72-SE2018.76)**

Following on from discussion at the last Senate meeting, where members discussed the ethical issues of offering training on cadavers at the University of Malta, the Human Tissue Authority has confirmed that surgical training using human material is permissible, and frequently undertaken in the UK. However, Queen Mary does not have ready access to suitable facilities of this type in London whereas this provision is already available at the University of Malta.
