1. Summary

This report summarises the main areas of discussion of the Research Advisory Group to the Vice-Principal (Research) at the meeting held on 26th February and 30th April 2019.

2. Membership

The Group agreed changes to the membership of VPRAG in light of the recent addition of the Deputy Vice-Principals and in an effort to reduce the burden of meeting attendance required by the Deputy-Dean roles. Deputy-Deans (for PGR and Impact) have been removed from the regular VPRAG attendees list but may be asked to deputise if Deans for Research, the Doctoral College Director or the DVP Research Impact are unavailable.

The terms of reference and membership of the Research Advisory Group are annexed.

3. Queen Mary Strategy and research enabling plan

The Group reviewed the draft research enabling plan for the Queen Mary Strategy and provided feedback. A proposal on governance arrangements for the new University Research Institutes was brought to the Group following this discussion and it was recommended that a clear policy on the use of PhD fee waivers be developed.

4. Supporting major grant applications

The Group discussed ways to support successful bids to major funding opportunities. It was agreed that recruitment of grant writing support was essential to support large, strategic bids and that it would be helpful to map out the next big five call themes on the horizon to enable early identification of potential teams of applicants, as well as ensuring strategic engagement with key funders, and building a series of events to help inform and enthuse researchers of strategic research funding opportunities.

5. Overhead recovery and Worktribe Development

The Group received and discussed the KPMG audit report on overhead recovery and discussed ways of using the Worktribe research grant management system to help maximise grant cost recovery. The potential for more bespoke development of the system to facilitate this will be investigated.

To develop and monitor strategies for research, including:

- To develop and monitor the delivery of internal and external KPIs for research at institutional level
- To make recommendations regarding policy on relations with external funding organisations and collaborators
- To make recommendations regarding the exploitation of research to the benefit of Queen Mary and staff
- To develop and monitor research support within the University, including costing and pricing, research grants management, business development, IP and commercialisation activities
- To develop, promote and support interdisciplinary and multi-disciplinary research, including identifying institutional level research themes and priorities
- To develop Queen Mary's strategic approach to internally and externally funded interdisciplinary Research Centres and Institutes and to monitor the success of these structures
- To develop and monitor high ethical standards in research in all research activities
- To monitor allegations of fraud and misconduct in research through an annual report on allegations and outcomes
- To be responsible for the oversight of risk management arrangements and the assessment of risk relating to research activity
- To be responsible for the oversight of the Doctoral College, including the recruitment, funding and training of doctoral students and postdoctoral researchers, and other strategic matters concerning these groups. The Research Advisory Group shall receive regular reports from the Doctoral College Management Group.
- To consider research ideas and proposals raised through other research forums.
