Part 1: Preliminary items

Minutes of the previous meeting (SE2018.53)

2018.115 Senate **approved** the minutes of the meeting held on 07 March 2019.

2018.116 Senate **approved** the minutes of the extraordinary meeting held on 14 May 2019.

President and Principal's report (SE2018.54)

2018.117 Senate **noted** the President and Principal's report.

- 2018.118 Members **noted** that an all-staff email had been circulated on 11 June 2019 to update staff on the Universities Superannuation Scheme (USS) pensions. Members had found the summary to be helpful and asked to be informed of further announcements.
- Members **noted** that the Augar Review of Post-18 Education and Funding had been published. The review had recommended tuition fees should be reduced to £7,500 a year. Other recommendations included lowering the graduate contribution threshold from £25,000 to £23,000 and extending the contribution period from 30 years after the completion of study to 40 years. The recommendations would need to be further considered by Parliament.
- 2018.120 Members **noted** that firm offer acceptances for undergraduate home and European Union (EU) applicants had increased since 2017-18 and that Postgraduate Taught (PGT) applications had also increased. Staff were thanked for their hard work in student recruitment.

Vice-Principals' Reports (SE2018.55a – SE2018.55g)

- 2018.121 Senate **noted** the report from the Vice-Principal (Health), (SE2018.55a).
- 2018.122 Senate **noted** the report from the Vice-Principal and Executive Dean (Humanities and Social Sciences), (SE2018.55b).
- Senate **noted** the report from the Vice-Principal and Executive Dean (Science and Engineering), (SE2018.55c). The Vice-Principal and Executive Dean (Science and Engineering) reported the following updates further to the written report:
 - Dr Christophe Eizaguirre had been appointed as the Deputy Dean for Research Impact;
 - Professor Teresa Alonso-Rasgado, Queen Mary's Dean for Global Engagement, had been awarded the Lazaro Cardenas Medal for academic excellence.
- 2018.124 Senate **noted** the report from the Interim Vice-Principal (Education) (SE2018.38d). The Vice-Principal (Education) reported the following updates further to the written report:
 - Professor Tony Michael had been appointed as the Deputy Vice Principal Education (Strategic Projects).
 - Professor Jo Brown had been appointed as the Deputy Vice Principal Education (Programmes).
- 2018.125 Senate **noted** the report from the Vice-Principal (International), (SE2018.38e).
- 2018.126 Senate **noted** the report from the Vice-Principal (Policy and Strategic Partnerships), (SE2018.38f).
- 2018.127 Senate **noted** the report from the Director of Research Services, (SE2018.38g).

Students' Union President's report (SE2018.56)

2018.128 Senate **noted** the report from the Students' Union President.

Part 2: Matters for Discussion

Teaching Excellence and Student Outcomes Framework (SE2018.57)

- 2018.129 Senate **received** a paper and presentation from the Vice-Principal (Education) on preparations for the Teaching Excellence Framework 5 (TEF 5), including the dry run exercise.
- Senate **noted** that, since its last meeting, schools had continued to build upon the work with Invisible Grail (www.invisiblegrail.com) to develop a draft narrative based on the TEF4 metric dataset in preparation for the dry run. The dry-run panel comprised students, academics and external experts who had assessed the TEF data and the draft narrative statement in order to arrive at the relevant TEF award for the exercise. Colleagues were given feedback on the 31 May 2019 and work would be undertaken with schools (subject areas) to work on recommendations in preparation for the January 2020 TEF 5 exercise. Schools and institutes had been asked to develop a 'whole-school/institute' approach to the TEF exercise, to understand their metrics fully and to work with students to address areas for improvement.
- The Vice-Principal (Education) thanked colleagues for the enormous amount of work that had gone in to the dry-run submissions. There had been some encouraging results following the exercise: the School of Mathematical Sciences had gone from lower bronze to middle silver and the School of Geography had demonstrated an excellent partnership between its staff and students.
- 2018.132 Members **noted** that metrics for TEF5 were expected to be released in October 2019.

Academic Regulations 2019-20 (SE2018.58a-e)

- 2018.133 Members **noted** that the academic regulations had been completely revised for 2019-20 in order to make them more concise and accessible for readers. Members were provided with a covering document that explained the changes, and noted that there were few policy changes for 2019-20.
- 2018.134 Members **noted** that extenuating circumstances processes were being reviewed as part of the Student Processes Improvement Programme (SPIP).
- Following discussion of the circumstances under which a student may change programme, Senate **agreed** to amend the wording of regulation 2.63 to permit flexibility in special circumstances. Regulation 2.63 would be amended from "in no circumstances will a student be permitted to change modules more than two weeks into the teaching of a module" to "only in exceptional circumstances will a student be permitted to change modules more than two weeks into the teaching of a module".
- 2018.136 Members **agreed** that specific aspects of the regulations, including permission to change modules, would be reviewed again before the 2020-21 version of the Academic Regulations was published.
- 2018.137 Senate **approved** the Academic Regulations 2019-20, subject to in the amended wording for Regulation 2.63.

2018.138 Senate **approved** the Academic Regulations for Research Programmes 2019-20, Academic Misconduct Policy, Appeal Policy and Interruption of Study Policy.

Assessment Handbook (SE2018.59)

- 2018.140 Senate **received** the Assessment Handbook for 2019-20. Members **noted** that terminology had been updated throughout and that the 'College Mark' had been replaced with 'Classification Mark'.
- 2018.141 Members **noted** that there had been two additions to the handbook for 2019-20:
 - the handbook now included a statement on scaling which reflected existing policy;
 - a paragraph explaining the relationship between semester-based examinations and the rules of the 'next available opportunity' for students resitting examinations.
- Members **noted** concerns about students publishing their work on external websites and whether this might constitute an assessment offence. Members noted that it was difficult to monitor this type of publication but schools and institutes were invited to raise concerns regarding incidents of this type with the Academic Registry and Council Secretariat.
- 2018.143 Senate **approved** the Assessment Handbook for 2019-20.

Admissions Policy (SE2018.60)

- 2018.144 Senate **received** the Queen Mary Admissions Policy for 2020-21 and the Policy for Admissions to Undergraduate Programmes in Medicine and Dentistry 2019 application and for 2020 entry.
- 2018.145 Members **noted** that only minor changes had been made to the policy for 2019-20. These changes included a response to guidance on criminal convictions and signposts to policies developed over the past year.
- 2018.146 Senate **approved** the Queen Mary Admissions Policy for 2020-21 and the Policy for Admissions to Undergraduate Programmes in Medicine and Dentistry 2019 application and for 2020 entry.

Code of Practice for Research Degree Programmes: proposed changes for 2019-20 (SE2018.61)

- 2018.147 Senate **received** a paper outlining the proposed changes to the Code of Practice for Research Degree Programmes for 2019-20 and the revised version of the code of practice.
- 2018.148 Members **noted** that the Research Degrees Programmes and Examinations Board (RDPEB) had recommended that research students would be able to enrol on three defined enrolment points each year, rather than at the beginning of each month. The recommendation was that students would only be able to enrol outside these three enrolment points in exceptional circumstances. Members requested further clarification of the exceptional circumstances in which a student would be permitted to enrol outside the three enrolment dates.
- 2018.149 Senate **approved** the Code of Practice for Research Degree Programmes for 2019-20 subject to clarification around exceptional enrolment.

2018.150

Senate **approved** the request to delegate the authority to approve any final minor revisions to the text of the Code of Practice for Research Degree Programmes for 2019-20 to the Chair of the RDPEB.

Freedom of Speech Policy (SE2018.62)

2018.151 Members **noted** that Senate had last reviewed the Freedom of Speech Policy in October 2017.

In March 2019 the Equality and Human Rights Commission (EHRC) published legal guidance on freedom of expression. Senate members had been invited to provide comments on the Freedom of Speech Policy or the EHRC guidance by 09 May 2019. The policy had been reviewed within Academic Registry and Council Secretariat (ARCS) in light of the EHRC guidance and the operation of the policy over the past year and no amendments were proposed.
