## **1. Higher Education (Freedom of Speech) Bill**

The Bill has reached the report stage in the House of Commons. The current version is available as follows <https://bills.parliament.uk/bills/2862>.

The current Freedom of Speech Policy is under review and, as discussed at the June meeting of Senate, we will be setting up two groups of colleagues and students drawn from across Queen Mary to review our current Policy in line with the amendments in legislation. With many thanks to those who have been in contact about the group; we will be in touch with more details in the coming weeks.

## **2. Office for Students: consultation on quality and standards conditions of registration**

In November 2020, the Office for Students launched a consultation on a range of issues related to regulating quality and standards in higher education. The second phase of the consultation builds on the initial consultation and sought feedback on the proposed changes to some of the 'B conditions' of registration. The proposals can be summarised as follows:

Proposal 1: for registered providers, three ongoing conditions of registration relating to quality and covering:

- i. Academic experience
- ii. Resources, support and student engagement
- iii. Assessment and awards.

Proposal 2: for registered providers, one revised ongoing condition of registration relating to standards that extends the definition of 'sector-recognised standards' to allow the regulation of undergraduate degree classifications.

Proposal 3: for providers seeking registration, two new initial conditions of registration that set evidence requirements in a way that is clearer and easier for high quality new providers to meet.

Proposal 4: revised guidance for each of these conditions that includes our approach to gathering evidence, assessment and compliance.

This consultation focused on the qualitative aspects of the conditions of registration; condition B3 *The provider must deliver successful outcomes for all of its students, which are recognised and valued by employers, and/or enable further study* will be consulted upon later in 2021, together with the proposed consultation on the Teaching Excellence Framework.
