Part 1: Preliminary items

Welcome and Apologies

2021.001 The Chair welcomed new members to Senate and **noted** the apologies.

Minutes of the previous meeting (SE2021.01)

2021.002 Senate **confirmed** the minutes of the meeting held on 10 June 2021.

Matters arising and Chair's actions (SE2021.02)

- 2021.003 Senate **noted** that the Professional Capability and Fitness to Practice Regulations and Committee membership had been approved by Chair's action.
- 2021.004 Senate **noted** that the term dates for 2026–27 had been approved by Chair's action.

Senate terms of reference and membership 2021–22 (SE2021.03)

- 2021.005 Members **noted** the terms of reference and membership for 2021–22. The following points were noted:
 - (i) The terms of reference were unchanged from last year. The membership list had been updated to include the new members.
 - (ii) The membership list would be updated to change 'Dean for Taught Programmes' to 'Dean for Education'.
 - (iii) Senate **approved** its terms of reference and membership for 2021–22 subject to the above amendment.

President and Principal's report (SE2021.04)

- 2021.006 Senate **received** the President and Principal's report. The following points were noted:
 - (i) Students had returned to campus for the start of the new academic year and had been welcomed by staff and the Students' Union. Halls of residence were fully booked for the academic year with over 2,500 students having moved into halls at the current time and staff were working hard to support students arriving from amber and red list countries.
 - (ii) Colleagues were thanked for their efforts in making Mixed Mode Education (MME) possible, and in supporting its continued success. Members **noted** that early issues with the implementation of the new technology had been resolved. Student assistants had been particularly helpful in supporting the resolution of technological issues.

Students' Union President's report (SE2021.06)

- 2021.015 Senate **received** the Students' Union President's report. The following points were noted:
 - (i) Welcome Week had been a success. There had been over 80 in person and online events, with over 10,500 entries recorded on campus.
 - (ii) Work would continue during 2021-22 on improving the representation structures for postgraduate research students.
 - (iii) The autumn elections were underway, and students could put themselves forward for over 400 positions; the majority of these were for Course Representative roles but there were also roles as National Union of Students (NUS) delegates, part-time officer positions and some roles for students based in Malta. QMSU had partnered with professional services and academic staff in schools and institutes to encourage students to put themselves forward for Course Representative roles.

Update on Sector Developments (SE2021.07)

- 2021.016 Senate **received** an update on sector developments. The following points were noted:
 - (i) The Higher Education (Freedom of Speech) Bill had reached the report stage in the House of Commons. Queen Mary would establish a working group to review the current Freedom of Speech Policy in line with the proposed amendments in legislation.
 - (ii) The Office for Students (OFS) had concluded the second phase of its consultation on regulating quality and standards in September 2021. This aspect of the consultation had focused on the qualitative aspects of the 'B' conditions of registration, and the next phase would focus on

student outcomes (condition B3) and the Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF).

- (iii) The OFS had recently published the report of its review of spelling, punctuation and grammar in assessment.
- (iv) Senate agreed that it would be helpful to receive a monthly mailing on sector and policy developments that may be of interest to members.

Academic Assurance Report (SE2021.08)

- 2021.017 Senate **received** the draft Academic Assurance Report 2020-2021. The following points were noted:
 - (i) Members noted the report of the external member of the Degree Examination Board (Appendix C) that had endorsed Queen Mary's approach to assessment and award during the Covid-19 pandemic. The report had observed that Queen Mary, in common with all higher education institutions, would need to reflect on how it would articulate its approach during 2020 and 2021 in its Degree Outcomes Statement. Members noted that a thorough analysis of student outcomes would take place once the data was available, and this analysis would feed into the Degree Outcomes Statement which would in turn be reviewed by Senate and Council before publication.
 - (ii) Senate **approved** the draft Academic Assurance Report 2020–21 for submission to Council.
