<b>Points for Senate members to note and further information</b>	Senate is asked to note the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Semester dates are currently approved to the academic year 2026/27.</li><li>• The student record system requires a minimum 5 years of academic dates at any one time to create accurate student records and to create CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies) dates required for visa purposes for international students.</li><li>• From the start of the next admissions cycle (late September / early October 2024), programmes of 5 years+ will need to be set-up requiring the approval of dates to 2031/32.</li><li>• September and January Welcome Weeks are noted in the academic calendar.</li><li>• The start of each semester will always commence on a Monday.</li><li>• Later years will be published as 'provisional' allowing for further changes to the academic year should the need arise.</li></ul>

## **Executive Summary**

Semester start and end dates are essential for planning the delivery of the curriculum, informing students when they are expected to be in attendance and notifying the Student Loans Company (SLC) of tuition fee liability and maintenance loan payment dates. The dates are also used in the creation of applicant and student records and in turn used in the submission of statutory returns such as HESA Data Futures.

Currently semester dates exist in the student record system up to and including 2026-2027. Further semester dates up to and including 2031-2032 are required to manage future applicant and student records.

## **Academic Year Amendments**

Semester dates have been approved for academic years up to and including 2026-27. The dates are published on the Queen Mary website with future years noted as 'provisional' in line with other universities.

To effectively set up programmes of 5 years or more from the start of the next admissions cycle requires the approval of semester dates up to and including 2031-2032. Proposed future dates follow the existing pattern of 12-week semesters with a welcome week for September and January starters and standard examination periods. The start of each semester of teaching will always commence on a Monday.

Whilst it is assumed vacation periods occur outside of the approved semester dates, the University is increasingly being asked to provide letters to international students setting out holiday periods as these are absent from existing web pages. Vacation periods will therefore be explicitly stated for standard programmes on the web site.

Appendix A lists the proposed academic dates for the years 2027-2028 through to 2031-2032.
