2020.064	O03: Environmental Sustainability policy to be presented to ESB The Chair stated that the Environmental Sustainability policy had been endorsed at an earlier meeting of the Sustainability Committee and Estate Strategy Board meetings. This policy would be presented to the Senior Executive Team (SET) for approval (PL)		
2020.065	O15: Update on Joseph Priestley energy efficiency project In the absence of IM, ND was not aware of the position on the energy saving project in the Joseph Priestly Building. Post meeting note: because of budget issues, the energy efficiency measures have not yet been implemented. The proposal is to tackle this work as part of the Chemical Engineering Research Labs project in this building which requires a number of plant and BMS upgrades		
2020.066	O09: Completed and on-going capital projects (energy efficiency) RF reported that the projected energy efficiency savings associated with the combine heat and power plants (CHPs) have been adversely affected by the partial closure of our buildings due to the current COVID-19 pandemic. The CHPs at the Charterhouse Square and Mile End Campuses are not operational, as there has been only limited heat and domestic hot water demand. Boilers are currently being used as substitutes for these CHPs. TL reported that air conditioning units would be used across our campuses as one of the options to minimise the transmission of COVID-19.		

	JB enquired if it is more financially and energy efficient to run boilers instead of these CHPs?
	RF and TL said that an appraisal report would be prepared in response to JB's query.
2020.067	QMUL adopted a 15-year 34% carbon reduction target against its 2004/05 carbon footprint. As at the end of the 2018/19 academic year; we had achieved this target and the current partial closure of our campuses during the 2019/20 academic year as a result of COVID-19 implies that we will significantly out-perform this target. 2020.068	The Environmental Sustainability Action Plan (ESAP) has been developed and structured to enable Queen Mary to deal with its immediate environmental challenges and lay the foundations to help us be better placed to develop a longer-term environmental sustainability strategy over the next two to three years. (PL/PT)
2020.069	The Head of Sustainability reported to the Committee that the Action Plan is our immediate and short-term response to the current and emerging environmental risks and challenges we face. This plan also details QMUL's six-year 30% carbon reduction target against its 2018/19 baseline. (PT)

2020.084	The Head of Sustainability presented an overview on the outcome of the electricity and gas service contracts. This 12-month fixed service will start on 1 October 2020. Renewable energy generation (Green electric tariffs) were secured on all our non-half-hour electric throughout the contract period. A savings of £1.04 million will be realised during the delivery period compared with our current energy contracts. We will continue to explore opportunities to increase the proportion of green electricity tariff that we use. (PT)
