He will speak about the move from TRIPS as a overarching multilateral framework to bilateral, plurilateral or regional character post-TRIPS. The speaker, an expert in international IP, WTO and investment law issues, will make a case for the continued relevance of the TRIPS Agreement as an overarching, multilateral framework for TRIPS-plus FTAs.

Dr Henning Grosse Ruse-Khan is a University Lecturer in Intellectual Property Law at the University of Cambridge and a Fellow of King's College. In Cambridge, Henning is Co-Director of the Centre for Intellectual Property and Information Law and a Fellow at the Lauterpacht Centre for International Law.
