

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### RELEVANT SOCIAL LANDMARKS IN ROMANIA

#### □ Sociolinguistic

 Academy-governed style of codification (The Romanian Academy), standardization from above /but/ after 1989, slight, gradual shift towards pluricentrism and to a free-enterprise style of codification (see Zafiu 2020:262)

### ☐ Sociopolitical & sociocultural

- Romania has been a member of the European Union since 2007.
- LGBTQIA+ marriages or civil unions are not legally recognized in Romania at this time, in spite of EU recommendations.

□gender-fair language = limbaj corect din perspectiva genului (>> 'language correct from the perspective of gender', 2008 European Parliament Gender-Neutral Language Guidelines) limbaj echitabil din perspectiva genului (>> 'language fair from the perspective of gender', Popovici 2021)

□non-sexist language = limbaj nonsexist (>>'language nonsexist')
(late 1990s - early 2000s, see Miroiu 2002)

 Gender Equality

- Limbaj nespecific **genului sau sexului**, care se referă la persoane în general, fără să se refere la femei și la bărbați
- (My emphasis, My translation: Language that is not specific to **gender or sex**, which considers persons in general, with no reference to women and men)
- Language that is not **gender-**specific and which considers people in general, with no reference to women and men.

- □ limbaj sensibil la gen (>>language sensitive at gender), e.g. University of Bucharest Gender Equality Guidelines)

### DIFFERENCES AND OVERLAPS

- ☐ for certain researchers, see Popovici 2021, gender-inclusive=gender-neutral= gender-fair=non-sexist
- □ gender-neutral = gender-inclusive=non-binary (various instances in the social or traditional media, including a 2021 podcast by Romanian activists, Gen & limbaj neutru, see a discussion in Vişan, forthcoming)
- □ Prominent LGBTQIA+ associations in Romania (Accept, MozaiQ) currently use **limbaj incluziv** (gender-inclusive) as a keyword:

\*Folosirea x-ului la finalul anumitor cuvinte are ca scop crearea unui limbaj incluziv, atât pentru persoanele non-binare, cât și pentru cele cis și trans (My translation: Using the –x at the end of certain words has the purpose of creating an inclusive language not only for non-binary persons, but also for cis and trans persons, Accept's Facebook Page)

□ Recent institutional recommendations in Romania make a clear difference between gender-neutral language defined as ("not taking gender into account") versus gender-sensitive language, seen as connected to the fair treatment of women and men, and as the best way of achieving inclusivity

### DEFINING GENDER-SENSITIVE RO/EN

# GRAMMATICAL GENDER IN ROMANIAN

- ❖ Romanian as a three-gender language (although there are linguists who dispute this >> "the so-called neuter") ❖ Overlaps of the gender assignment for +animate nouns with what is considered the biological sex of the individual
- Syncretism between masculine and neuter forms the singular msg = nsg [Agreement]
- ❖ Syncretism between feminine and neuter forms in the plural fpl=npl [Agreement]
- ❖ The generic masculine is always used for mixed-gender groups when the referent is animate

  - Fetele şi băieţii sunt buni.
  - girls(fpl) & boys(mpl) are good(mpl)
- Like in other languages, the masculine is used as an 'unmarked', generic form, as in: ➤ General advice: When you are tired you need a change (tired = msg form in Romanian).
  - ➤ Generalization: We are all tired from time to time (all, tired = mpl forms in Romanian)

### A NOTE REGARDING ROLE NOUNS

 Colloquial Romanian & Standard Romanian (Current, frequent use)

- (Ea) este profesoară/ (Ea) este lingvistă/ (Ea) este președintă/ (Ea) este studentă.
- [(she) is [ [N\_job\_ title]+FEMININE SINGULAR SUFFIX]
- She is a teacher/She is a linguist/She is a president/she is a student

- Standard Romanian but only in formal registers (Until recently – Institutional guidelines, Laws, Rules and regulations)
- Ea este profesor./ Ea este lingvist/Ea este președinte/Ea este student.
- [she is [N\_job\_title]+FEMININE SINGULAR SUFFIX]
- She is a teacher/She is a linguist/She is a president/She is a student.

### ON THE NEUTRAL(?MASCULINE/NEUTER) IN GENDER-NEUTRAL

- Cu toate acestea, folosirea limbajului neutru vine cu unele dezavantaje: de obicei această abordare va favoriza perspectiva masculină, ca cea de bază, punând astfel în umbră diferențele de roluri, situații sau nevoi specifice celor două genuri. (UEFSCDI, 2023)
- Nevertheless, the use of gender-neutral language is not without its disadvantages: generally, this kind of approach will favour the masculine perspective, taking it as basic, and thus overshadowing the difference in roles, situations or specific needs between the two genders (My translation, my emphasis)

### THE MASCULINE AS A 'HYPERGENDER'

- Întrucât, în general, se acceptă faptul că, în română, masculinul are o valoare neutră, de «hipergen», atunci când este folosit pentru denumirile generice de profesii și funcții, se recomandă utilizarea formelor de feminin în următoarele cazuri: a) când se particularizează o profesie sau o funcție și se face referire directă la o persoană de sex feminin sau b) când există în textul original (în cazul în care problema se pune la nivelul traducerii) intenția clară de a desemna în mod explicit atât persoanele de sex masculin, cât și cele de sex feminin. (My emphasis)
- Because, in general, it is an accepted fact that, in Romanian, the masculine has a neutral value, that of a
  "hypergender", when it is used for generic professions or functions, the recommendation is to employ
  feminine forms in the following situations: (a) when a profession or a function is used in a particular
  situation to directly refer to a person of female gender or (b) when the source text (in case this is a
  translation issue) holds the clear intention to designate both the persons of male gender and persons of
  female gender (My translation, my emphasis)

### 'RIDICULOUS'&/OR 'IMPOSSIBLE' GENDER-NEUTRAL ROMANIAN

- The Romanian Academy: Vintilă-Rădulescu (2010): the "so-called", "ridiculous" gender-neutral language
- The European Parliament:
- LIMBAJUL INCLUZIV/NONSEXIST ÎN LIMBA ROMÂNĂ
- În limba română, fiind o limbă cu gen gramatical marcat (masculin/feminin/neutru), nu se poate crea un limbaj propriu-zis neutru din punctul de vedere al genului.
- GENDER-INCLUSIVE/NONSEXIST LANGUAGE IN ROMANIAN
- In Romanian, which is a language which marks grammatical gender (masculine/feminine/neuter), it is impossible to create a genuine gender-neutral language (My translation, my emphasis).

## GENDER-NEUTRAL - TO CONSIDER, GENDER-SENSITIVE - TO USE AS OFTEN AS POSSIBLE

- Tipuri de limbaj: 1. Limbaj sexist (de evitat) 2. Limbaj neutru la gen (de luat în considerare) 3. Limbaj sensibil la gen (de folosit cât mai des)
- Exemplu:
- a) În sondajul "X" din anul 2022, 18% din persoanele cu vârste cuprinse între 18-25 ani au declarat că au avut cel puţin o experienţă de discriminare de gen în ultimul an (limbaj neutru la gen)
- b) În sondajul "X" din anul 2022, 25 % dintre femei și 5% dintre bărbații cu vârste cuprinse între 18-25 de ani au declarat că au avut cel puțin o experiență de discriminare de gen în ultimul an (limbaj sensibil la gen)

- Types of language: 1. Sexist language (to be avoided) 2. Gender-neutral language (to take into consideration) 3. Gender-sensitive language (to use as often as possible)
- Example: a) In a certain poll of 2022, 18% of the persons aged 18-25 stated they had at least a gender discrimination experience in the last year (gender-neutral language)
- b) In a certain poll of 2022, 25% of the women and 5% of the men aged 18-25 stated they had at least a gender discrimination experience in the last year (gender-sensitive language) (My translation)

### THE INCLUSIVITY SCALE IN LANGUAGE

My retranslation into English of the Romanian inclusivity scale present in the <u>Inclusive</u> <u>Communication Kit</u> of the Executive Agency for Higher Education, Research, Development, and Innovation Funding. The Romanian translation is, in fact, an unacknowledged translation of the inclusivity scale provided by the European Institute for Gender Equality

Avoid sexist/discriminatory/biased language

Consider neutral/blind language

Favour gender-sensitive language

### SENSITIVE/BINARY

- Gender-neutral language = "not taking gender into account, referring to people in general, not taking into account the fact that they are men or women"
- Example:
- Oamenii nu sunt conștienți de impactul pe care-l au asupra mediului înconjurător. [Masculine plural inflection]
- People are not aware of the impact they have on the environment.
- Gender-sensitive language defined as the equal treatment of both men and women
- Example:
- Angajatele şi angajaţii acestei instituţii...[Feminine plural noun & Masculine plural noun]
- The female employees and the male employees of this institution...

### CONCLUSIONS

- ☐ Gender = tendency towards erasure; tends to be omitted from the Romanian translations of 'gender-inclusive' or 'gender-neutral'
- Neutralization = relevant as part of institutional discourse regarding equity but represented either as "impossible" or as "to be taken into consideration" (yet not as the preferred choice)
- □ Feminization = new awareness, revival & new emphasis of an older strategy in Romanian, seen as acceptable by The Romanian Academy even when institutional guidelines adopted the 'unmarked' masculine; re-alignment of Academy policy-makers with institutional policy-makers
- □ Inclusivity = gender-inclusive undergoes generalization, as the umbrella term "inclusive"
- ☐ Sensitivity = the Romanian 'gender-sensitive' does not make non-binary persons visible

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
