LinkedIn Guidelines for WIPH Centres

How to set up a Centre LinkedIn Page

- If you would like to create a LinkedIn page for your Centre, please contact the WIPH Digital Media Officer (<u>t.andriamasomanana@qmul.ac.uk</u>)
- The Centre LinkedIn page will be set up as a sub-page of the QMUL LinkedIn page by Tom Crookston (QMUL Social Media Manager)
- Once the Centre LinkedIn page has been set up:
- Before adding followers it is useful to start putting up a few posts
- The WIPH Digital Media Officer can promote the page on the WIPH LinkedIn page

Requirements for setting up a Centre LinkedIn page

- Ensure that the staff member who will have administrative rights to the Centre LinkedIn page has a personal LinkedIn account
- The affiliation to WIPH must be clearly visible on the Centre LinkedIn page – e.g. 'WIPH Centre for Public Health and Policy'
- Use the QMUL icon from your Centre X/Twitter page as the icon for the Centre LinkedIn page
- The WIPH Digital Media Officer will have administrative rights to the Centre LinkedIn page (and act as a back-up administrator to the Centre page)

Creating Engaging Content on LinkedIn

- Use a combination of both quick, bold posts of 2-3 sentences and long-form posts.
- Incorporate photos/videos across posts intermittently. The optimum image size 1200 x 627. You can upload more than one image per post.
- Post consistently, whether it's daily, weekly or fortnightly. Choose a schedule that makes sense to your page, audience and objective.

What to post/repost on Centre LinkedIn Pages

- Events (seminars, presentations, conferences, etc.). This can be posted either before the event or after the event
- Job adverts/vacancies within your Centres
- Accomplishments within your Centres/Units
- Publications (academic articles, books, etc.)
